#### LOCAL FLORIDA ROAD NEWS

#### SR 528 Causeway

There have been a number of neighbors that have expressed concerns about the activities on the sides of the 528 causeway. Increasing numbers of vehicles stopping along the highway increases risks of accidents, ugly trash on the roadsides and in the water which affects our recreation, and the erosion of the causeways themselves.

#### A quick look at SR 520

shows that it has been designed and managed in a way that prevents and limits these same issues. It has been suggested that we make phone calls, write letters and email our Florida state legislators and FDOT to bring enough attention to this issue that it becomes a higher priority for them.

#### UPCOMING CONSTRUCTION

There will be many improvements made in the near future on SR 520 in Cocoa between Aurora St (west of US 1) and the Hubert Humphrey Causeway across the IRL. Changes will be made to the design, road surface, curbs, as well as the pedestrian and bike lanes. SR 528 between US 1 and SR 3 / Courtenay will be resurfaced and have other upgrades and improvements to the design and drainage.



#### WHAT'S GOING ON AT MARKER 24?



When an established marina on South Banana River Drive became the Marker 24 Marina in 2018, the new owners planned a "lifestyle community and marina" with 24 upscale homes and a private waterfront clubhouse, centered on a full service marina. Five years on, the marina stays busy, but only one home has been completed, with another under construction.

The marina hosts a popular waterfront restaurant with live entertainment, catering to boat traffic. Large yachts fill most of the slips, including several belonging to a Freedom Boat Club franchise.

The original partners, both based in Vero Beach, have divided the property between Marker 24 Marina LLC and Marker 24 Development LLC, the latter owning a large tract west of the yacht basin now used 



#### SPRING FLOWERS



If you didn't see Sally Scalera's article in Florida Today on 3/25, here are a few highlights. Our local native bees are more effective pollinators so it makes sense to plant more native flowers to attract and sustain them.

They also don't sting like the European honeybees and live alone with small individual nests, mostly underground. These "bumble bees pollinate many of our most common vegetables."

Choose sunny areas in your yard for native flowering plants & if you must use pesticides contact the extension office for the safest methods.

Her top native flower recommendations: Solidago stricta & S.sempervirens (goldenrods), Helianthus (sunflowers), Heterotheca subaxillaris (false goldenrod), Chryopsis (goldenaster), Coreopsis (tickseed), Rudbeckia hirta(Coneflower) and more.

The keystone species Helianthus debilis, East Coast dune sunflower, will provide year-round flowers in dry locations without irrigation.
