

OUR LEGACY-THE BREVARD ZOO'S AQUARIUM PROPOSAL

The East Coast Zoological Society with the Brevard Zoo is planning on developing a 14 acre plot in Cape Canaveral along the Banana River to make a state-of-the-art Aquarium and Conservation Center. The land is adjacent to the port and is an ideal area to which people who are cruising can go after they turn in their luggage, go after their trip, or go should they just decide to stay in Brevard awhile. The site will emphasize conservation of our valuable resources such as the Indian River, the Atlantic Ocean, and the St. John's River. It will become the second Brevard Zoo campus for sea turtle and manatee rehabilitation, help which the current facilities are not large enough to handle readily. It will be user friendly with hands-on experiences for children and families.

The stated goals are to:

- Educate with innovative programs that connect the observers with nature
- Expand the shoreline efforts and other restoration programs to save the Indian River Lagoon
- Strengthen the zoo's superior care for its animals with up-to-date veterinary technologies and expansion for rehabilitation and release facilities
- Create 900 jobs and increase property values
- Contribute an \$85 million economic impact
- Enhance our region's ability to attract and retain a high-wage high-talent work force

The project will cost \$100 million and now \$54 million has been secured and promised. Obviously, more money needs to be donated, and as a concerned Brevard community, the project hopes we will all become involved financially and physically as volunteers. This is a wonderful opportunity for all of us to add to the positives of the Brevard Space Coast, i.e., the Kennedy Space Center, the Cruise Ship Industry, and tourism.
