Many of us strive to make our properties safer for our priceless Lagoon & restore our little piece of paradise. This last month we had Zach Marchetti as our speaker & he told us about the many things that the Brevard Zoo has been doing. The Zoo's science based "programs aimed at balancing the Indian River Lagoon (IRL) ecosystem" has become an important resource to our community over the years as it has increased hands on Actions and research for our Lagoon. He showed us many photos of rescued animals that had been treated & restored so that they could be returned to their homes.

Zach also showed photos of some of the "thousands of volunteers from the community working steadily on living shoreline solutions that restore populations of native. filter-feeding oysters to the lagoon. grow protective mangroves, seed restorative clam beds, replace nutri-

ent-rich seagrasses, restore & build new reefs, and create buffer zones to stem pollution and algae blooms."

Talk to your neighbors about what they are doing to protect our quality of life & our economy. They'll be happy to show you their oyster nurseries, their beautiful waterfront buffer-zone landscaping and their oyster gardens. There are also neighbors with mangrove nurseries that protect the mangroves until they are large enough to withstand the waves growing in new areas. North Banana River Drive bridges were recently reviewed and had some repairs done. You'll remember if you drove through when one of the lanes was closed. We've reached out to County Roads and Bridges and are still waiting to get the reports back on what was done and what still needs to be done.

If you've driven past 2020 N Banana River Drive just south of Sandpiper Street then you've seen them filling in the lot all the way up to the height of the road at the bridge. This lot construction was discussed at our last meeting and complaints have been made to the County & Florida DEP. Inspections have found violations and they are expected to make corrections. If you have any more concerns about violations, you can make calls to County Permitting 321-633-2069 and the Florida DEP 407-897-4100.
